## DR. RICHARD OSBORN '65



After graduating from Monterey Bay Academy in 1965, Dick Osborn went on to attend and graduate from Columbia Union College in Takoma Park, MD. He continued on to graduate studies attaining his Masters degree and Ph.D. from the University of Maryland and the Institute for Educational Management at Harvard University. He is now Associate Director for the Senior College/University Commission division of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), where he is responsible for 39 campuses.

Dick has worked at every level of education: elementary teacher and principal, academy teacher and principal, conference superintendent, union Director of Education, North American Division Vice President for Educa-

tion where he served on 15 college/university boards, and eight years as President of Pacific Union College providing one of the most important backgrounds for his current position.

Dick has always tried to be involved in professional volunteer work outside of the church. He has served many organizations, a few of which are:

- Chair of the Curriculum Committee for the National Council for Social Studies
- Chair of the Denominational Executives in Church-Related Higher Education
- Secretariat of the National Association of Independent Colleges & Universities
- President of the Council for American Private Education (an umbrella group representing associations with over 80% of all non-public school students in America)
- Chair of the Association of Independent California Colleges & Universities with 76 colleges/universities ranging in size from USC and Stanford to PUC and smaller institutions.

According to Dick, his professional work for the church and his volunteer service provided an important background for working with the accreditation of colleges and universities in California. He is also a published author of many works on both education and history subjects.

Dick's wife, Norma, serves as an Associate Pastor for the Pacific Union College Church. They have two children: Heather, an attorney residing in the Napa Valley, and Trevan, an associate pastor for Patterson Avenue SDA Church. Dick and Norma reside in Angwin, CA.

## HARVEY VOTH



Harvey Voth holds the distinguished honor of being the longest-serving principal in Monterey Bay Academy history. He led MBA through its greatest enrollment growth period and oversaw the addition of the new gymnasium in the 1970s and the MBA church in 1980—the only new buildings to be added to the campus since the 1950s.

Alumni and staff alike have fond memories of “the Voth years” at MBA. All felt appreciated and nurtured by him, where the very name—Voth—instantly invokes a smile and warm thoughts.

During his tenure at MBA in the 1950s, and before the establishment of the MBA airstrip, he was known to circle the strawberry fields in his plane, hollering down to the field workers to get out of the way before he landed neatly between the strawberry rows. Then he would taxi the plane up to his house and park it in a field across the street.

Harvey served at MBA for a total of 27 years:

- 1950–1951 Industrial Arts teacher (1 year)
- 1951–1959 Boys’ Dean (8 years)
- 1970–1988 Principal (18 years)

And served as principal in the following academies:

- 1959–1965 Hawaiian Mission Academy
- 1965–1970 Lodi Academy
- 1995–1996 Hawaiian Mission Academy, called out of retirement

Harvey Voth passed away on January 26, 2001—11 years ago. He is survived by his wife, Norma Jeane, daughter, Diane (Voth) Hendrickson and her husband Bill, and daughter-in-law, Barbara Voth. His two sons, Daniel and David ‘80, have both passed away. Harvey has eight grandchildren, four of whom are MBA graduates.

## LESLIE AND VIRGINIA GOODWIN



Clocking in at 34 years each, Leslie and Virginia Goodwin were some of the longest serving teachers on the MBA campus. In 1962, Leslie was called by then-principal Elder Rolland Howlett to teach history and Bible. Upon arriving at MBA, Virginia was asked by the Central California Conference educational secretary to take over teaching at the MBA elementary school.

Much loved by both students and staff alike, they dedicated their careers to teaching both elementary and academy students. Virginia held a variety of roles, including teaching at MBA's elementary school, teaching German and math at the academy, and working in the library—while Leslie taught Bible and history class at the academy.

Virginia implemented the school's first alumni program and both Virginia and Leslie served as alumni sponsors from 1969–1996. They currently hold honorary board positions for the Alumni Association. They both traveled with Oceanaires and Westwinds on their tours as Leslie narrated the concerts.

Leslie and Virginia met at Pacific Union College in the fall of 1948. It was love at first sight and the couple married in the summer of 1950. Virginia graduated in 1951 with a major in home economics and a minor in German, while Leslie graduated in 1952 with a history degree. They had three children: Sylvia '71, Paul '74, and Pam '74. Leslie retired in 1994 and Virginia in 1996. They reside in Sonora, CA.

Garnering respect from students and alumni alike, Fred and Arladell have enjoyed significant professional accomplishments during their time working in the Adventist denomination.

## STEVE WALLS



Throughout his 41 years of employment at MBA, Steve Wall's dedication and enthusiasm for teaching has never wavered.

The longest serving staff member in MBA school history, Steve first came to MBA in the summer of 1967, after being recruited by then-principal Carl Jorgensen. Steve had just graduated from Pacific Union College with a bachelor's degree in English and a minor in religion. However, with student loans to repay, he was looking for a job—any job. MBA needed a summer boy's dean, so he took it with no promises beyond the summer. In the coming fall, MBA needed a typing teacher—so Steve became the typing teacher.

A year later, Steve was finally teaching what he had gone to school for, and by his second year at MBA he was an English instructor. Steve held a variety of different positions at MBA, including head boys' dean, but from 1972 on, he was all English.

He was also actively involved in extracurricular activities on the MBA campus, including sponsoring the ASB for a few years in the 70s, plus nine different graduating classes and the four-year club throughout the years.

Professionally, Steve was recognized as a:

- 1994 Zapara Award winner for excellence in teaching
- 2006 Alumni Awards Foundation award winner for excellence in teaching
- Member of the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE)

Steve now serves on the MBA campus as a volunteer, where he has been in charge of attendance for the past four years. He and his wife Linda still live on the MBA campus.
